- 12 Ayston
The parish of Ayston is an old inclosure. It contains 870 acres, the greater part is convertible land. The quantity in tillage is much the same as has been known in the memory of man.
- 17 Barrowden
The parish of Barrowden is unenclosed.
- 33 Braunston
This statement hath been procured by Thomas Woods the parish clerk. The parish is now under a survey for inclosure.
- 39 Burley
Crops very fine. Well got in.
- 15/470 Caldecott (see Lyddington below)
- 15/276 Empingham
The soil in the parish of Empingham is chiefly upon the limestone and in general light.
- 186 Essendine (See the note attached to Ryhall below for the combined return Ryhall cum Essendine.)
- 92 Glaston
The harvest was fine throughout. The grain of all kinds was secured, in the best possible condition in this parish; and is of superior quality. Turnips were injured by the dry season in harvest and in general are not equal to the usual crops whether in size or quality. Wheat yields 26 Winchester bushels per acre, a total of 126 quarters and 6 bushels, rye 34 and 63 - 6, barley 36 and 373 - 4, oats 40 and 315 - 0 and potatoes 100 and 75.
- 100 Hambleton
Hambleton is old inclosure. You may reckon an other acre of potatoes in the homesteads etc.
- 15/448 Ketton
The annexed is collected from as good information as I could obtain; but still the particulars are not accurate. The aggregate I have no doubt, is correct.

44 Little Casterton

This account is by computation. Great part of the parish was inclosed Lady Day 1797: And by a rough computation, as many acres seem to be sown with grain each year as were before the inclosure; and the produce are more, allowing for the unfavourable seasons.

15/470 Lyddington with the chapelry of Caldecott

Lyddington wheat averages 1,136 bushels or 142 quarters, barley 2,560 or 320, oats 480 or 60, potatoes 480 or 60, beans 4,800 or 600 and rye 48 or 6. Caldecott wheat averages 828 or 103½, barley 1,680 or 210, oats 96 or 12 and beans 4,480 or 560. N.B. The parish of Lyddington with the chapelry of Caldecott have been under an act of inclosure for the three last years. The allotments were expected last, but are not yet set out, and during the whole period, the farmers have kept back the manure, and in other respects neglected the proper cultivation of the land. From these circumstances and the nature of the soil (which is strong and clayey) and the wetness of the season, the crop, in the wheat and barley is not half the usual quantity.

139 Manton

The whole parish contains about 940 acres of which full 800 are constantly in grass, indeed the land is much better adapted for pasturage than for the plough, very little of it being of that convertible nature, which abounds so much in many of the neighbouring parishes, and is always better for being alternately under the plough, and in grass, about 4 years the former, and 6 or 8 the latter: Manton is situated between the corn district of Lincolnshire and Northamptonshire and the grazing district of Leicestershire, partaking more of the latter. In the grazing district, according to the ideas of this neighbourhood, there is much of the convertible land which may with great advantage be occasionally put under the plough, if the landowners would permit their tenants, who could ever afford to give higher rents for such permission, an instance or two has occurred.

141 Market Overton

The crops in general have been plentiful and the quality of them is said to be good.

135 North Luffenham

The crops very abundant and well gathered.

157 Oakham

One farmer refuses to give any account.

170 Pilton

The parish consists of only 330 acres, uninclosed. The harvest was commonly favourable and it is generally allowed by the farmers in the parish of Pilton and in the neighbourhood, that such a general crop has not been known for these last eight

years. The wheat on some lands was rather (?), but the goodness of the wheat where there was no (?) was never superior in quantity or quality.

174 Preston

Preston has been inclosed about 26 years, and generally speaking, the same number of acres have been yearly cultivated with the different sorts of grain etc. as herein specified, as the soil is proper for tillage, the crops have been productive. I believe the lordship may contain about 1,100 acres.

179 Ridlington

I had this account of the number of acres of the different sorts of grain grown in this parish from (?) farmers, which I think may be pretty exact, there are several small pieces of ground set with potatoes, as well as we can estimate about ten acres; Ridlington is an old inclosure. More land has been ploughed this year, than in former years, generally speaking and crops are good.

186 Ryhall

The parish of Ryhall being newly inclosed, neither wheat nor rye was grown. The farmers very readily communicated every information which I desired.

197 Stoke Dry

Note, the lordship is an old inclosure and has long been occupied as park and meadow land.

207 Thistleton

The lordship has been inclosed about 42 years and is never laid with grass in order to be permanent. Clover is frequently grown. The crops of corn this year are above the average. The whole parish consists of about 1,300 acres.

221 Wardley

The parish of Wardley contains 535 acres. It is an old inclosure and excepting the last two years has been all in grass upwards of half a century.
