510	Maulden	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
550	Northill	Potatoes in fact 17 - 0 - 28.
614	Ridgmont	Actually Ridgmont cum Segenhoe in 1801.
738	Studham	In 1801 Studham was partly in Hertfordshire but mainly in Bedfordshire. It is now entirely in Bedfordshire.
789	Tilbrook	Was in Bedfordshire, now in Huntingdonshire.

BERKSHIRE

	Reading	Found in HO/42/221.
97/8	Stratfield Mortimer	Described as just Mortimer in the document. Stratfield Mortimer is on the Hampshire/Berkshire border but in both counties. It is here counted in Berkshire.

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE

179	Chalfont St Peter	The figure for wheat includes 58 acres of French wheat. Incorrectly endorsed on document as in Bedfordshire.
312-13	Fulmer	There are two separate returns for this place both submitted by the same incumbent. The second one differs from the first in that the turnips are omitted and beans are recorded as 4½ acres.
385	Hedsor	Wheat actually 10 - 1 - 27 and oats 20 - 0 - 28.
897	Langley	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
519	Milton Keynes	Was in Buckinghamshire, now in Bedfordshire.
578	Penn	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
808	Upton	This could be either Upton cum Chalvey in the south of the county or the hamlet of Upton, in Dinton-with-Ford and Upton in central Buckinghamshire. It may be that the latter is counted in the Dinton return no.243.

- 839 Westbury Wheat actually 144 - 2 - 2 and oats 125 - 0 - 18.
- 4/221 Wotton Underwood The document is unclear, the entries for potatoes, peas, turnips or rape and rye may each be zero.
- 897 Wraysbury Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

CAMBRIDGESHIRE

- 2 Bartlow See also the Ashdon and Bartlow entry for Essex.
- 10 Comberton In fact the acreages are entered as wheat 218 and 3 roods, barley 218 and 3 roods and $\frac{1}{2}$, oats 255 and 4 roods and $\frac{1}{2}$, rye 6 and 3 roods, peas and beans 218 and $\frac{1}{2}$ rood and turnips 1 rood and $\frac{1}{2}$. If it was not for the fact that for oats over 4 roods is mentioned it would be possible to interpret as the usual 4 roods equals one acre.
- 14 Dry Drayton The 200 acres peas and beans includes clover.
- 18 Fulbourn The 129 acres of turnips or rape includes tares, clover and lentils.
- 23 Hardwick Potatoes actually 0 - 0 - 20.

CESHIRE

- 9 Ashton upon Mersey Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
- 42 Eccleston Not to be confused with Eccleston in Lancashire which states that it is Eccleston (near Chorley), and therefore indisputably the one in Lancashire. Both are in the Diocese of Chester.
- 107 Thurstaston Incorrectly endorsed on document as in Lancashire.
- 115 West Kirby Incorrectly endorsed on document as in Lancashire.

CORNWALL

- 1 Altarnun Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
- 11 Camborne Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
- 65 North Hill Turnips actually 38 - 0 - 5.
- 126 Treneglos and Warbstow Potatoes actually 11 acres and 80 yards, turnips or rape actually 7 acres and 11 yards.

CUMBERLAND

5/1	Ainstable	Peas actually 45 - 0 - 20.
5/9	Bolton	Identified as Bolton, Cumberland a rectory parish, rather than Bolton, Westmorland a chapelry. The PRO place name index identifies as a place called Botton in Lancashire. I disagree.
5/42	Kirkland	There were two Kirklands in 1801, one a township and the other a parish. This is probably the parish, near Penrith.
26/310	Mosser	The Mosser figures are the aggregate of the three divisions of Mosser chapelry. This return is found in the Diocese of York returns but in fact is misplaced because it was in the Diocese of Chester. Turnips actually 9 - 2 - 20.
5/50	Orton	The document says Orton, in Cumberland though in fact in the same Diocese there was and is another Orton, this second in the county of Westmorland.

160	Croxhall	Was partly in Staffordshire but mainly in Derbyshire, now in Staffordshire.
82	Darley	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
87	Doveridge	Potatoes actually 21 - 1 - 20.
125	Hartington and Biggin	Potatoes actually 9 - 3 - 13, turnips actually 177 - 0 - 24.
189	North Wingfield	Barley actually 139 - 0 - 4, potatoes actually 35 - 0 - 10.
229	Scarcliffe	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
241	Spondon	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
244	Stapenhill	See Notes. I assume that the larger figure refers to land in Staffordshire. The place is now in Staffordshire.
270	Trusley	The page of this return is torn and so the barley acreage could be 1 or 10-19.
284	Whittington	Wheat actually 140 - 2 - 20.

DEVON

4	Axminster	Wheat acreage includes 2½ acres of Buckwheat.
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DORSET

6 Fontmell Magna In the notes the document says the figures are inclusive of the hamlet of Norgrove. I think this must be Hartgrove.

DURHAM

98 Auckland,
St Helen Potatoes actually 54 - 1 - 8.

28 Coniscliffe Comprising I assume both the townships of High Coniscliffe and Low Coniscliffe.

30 Crayke In 1801 this place was in Durham ecclesiastically but completely surrounded by parts of Yorkshire North Riding. Now it is in Yorkshire North Riding.

37 Dinsdale I assume this is Low Dinsdale on the River Tees in Durham, as distinct from Over Dinsdale on the opposite bank of the river in Yorkshire North Riding.

99 Durham St Oswald In addition barley, peas and beans combined 4 acres oats and beans 15, peas and beans 13.

26/1 Washington Wrongly entered in the documents of the Diocese of York. It was in the Diocese of Durham.

ESSEX

6 Ashdon and
Bartlow Bartlow was ecclesiastically partly in Essex but actually in Cambridgeshire, as it is today, and in the Diocese of Ely. See also Bartlow entry in Cambridgeshire.

61 Colchester St
Michael Mile End It is clear from the notes attached to this return that the figures refer to the year 1796.

79/80 Felsted This document not paginated but found between numbers 79-80.

113 Great Horkesley It is clear from the notes attached to this return that the figures refer to the year 1796.

133 Lawford Wheat average includes 5 acres of French wheat.

158 Nevendon This return incorrectly endorsed as in Kent.

173 Raynham Entered as Rainham and endorsed as in Kent. The Kent Rainham was in Diocese of Canterbury and so this return is assumed to be Raynham in Essex, in the Diocese of London.

76	Dorsington	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Warwickshire.
83	Dymock	In addition there was 70 acres of fallow, 19 of teasles and 2 of woad.
78	Doynton	Potatoes actually 12 - 0 - 20.
242	Fifield	This place was and is in Oxfordshire, but is counted here because the return is included in the Westcote, Gloucestershire figures.
113	Hinton on the Green	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Worcestershire.
242	Idbury	Same note as for Fifield above.
119	Kemerton	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Worcestershire.
136	Long Marston	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Warwickshire.
23/95	Minety	Was in Gloucestershire in 1801 for census purposes but locally situate in Wiltshire, now in Wiltshire.
45	North Cerney	Wheat actually 387 - 3 - 37, potatoes actually 10 - 0 - 21.
159	Pebworth	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Worcestershire.
163&164	Preston	One of these is in Dymock and the other near Cirencester but I cannot tell which one is which.
165	Preston on Stour	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Warwickshire.
167	Quinton	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Warwickshire.
188	Shenington	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Oxfordshire.
215	Sutton-under-Brailes	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Warwickshire.
240	Welford-on-Avon	Was in Gloucestershire, now in Warwickshire.

HAMPSHIRE

- 9 Ashmansworth See also 270 East Woodhay with Ashmansworth (chapelry). Ashmansworth was a parish but the living was a perpetual curacy annexed to the rectory of East Woodhay. I think the acreages refer in the first case to Ashmansworth and in the second only to East Woodhay.
- 35 Bramshott Wheat acreage includes 18 acres of Buckwheat.
- 159 Milton There were two Miltons in Hampshire. I think this return refers to Milton the parish near Christchurch rather than to Milton the locality in Portsmouth.
- 160 Minstead with Lyndhurst (chapelry) Wheat actually 189 - 1 - 25.
- 179 Penton Mewsey Potatoes actually 0 - 1 - 25.
- 227 Tadley See also 178 Overton with Tadley (chapelry). Tadley was a parish but the living was a perpetual curacy annexed to the vicarage of Overton. I think the acreages refer in the first case to Tadley and in the second only to Overton.
- 230 Thruxton Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

JERSEY

- 198 St Peter Because of an indistinct document the turnips could easily read 24 acres.

HEREFORDSHIRE

- 85 Farlow Farlow was a chapelry in Stottesden parish. The chapelry was in Herefordshire and the parish was mainly in Shropshire. Now they are both in Shropshire.
- 11/127 Lea In 1801 this place was in both Herefordshire and Gloucestershire but mainly in Herefordshire. Now it is entirely in Herefordshire.
- 147 Linton There were and are two Lintons in Herefordshire.
- 222 Stoke Bliss In 1801 this place was partly in Worcestershire but mainly in Herefordshire. Today it is in Worcestershire.

230 Tiberton

Spelt Tibberton in the document and endorsed as in Worcestershire. However the Worcestershire Tibberton was in the Diocese of Worcester and anyway is accounted for in the returns for that Diocese. I assume therefore that the place referred to is Tiberton, Herefordshire in the Diocese of Hereford.

807 Upton

Of the many Uptons within the Diocese of Lincoln this one is identified as Upton, near Coppingford in the county of Huntingdon.

906 Wyton

The document is incorrectly endorsed as in Leicestershire.

KENT

9 Beaufield

Beaufield aliter Whitfield in the document.

29 Brook

The oats entry is smudged in the document and could easily be 411 acres.

20/7 Cowden

Cowden in the Diocese of Rochester identified as Cowden near East Grinstead. Wheat actually 384 - 1 - 20.

51 Deal

Potatoes actually 33 - 0 - 11, turnips or rape 23 - 3 - 20.

78 Goodnestone

Wheat actually 53 - 2 - 11.

130 Great Mongeham

Barley actually recorded as 200.1/3 in the document.

94 Hothfield

Beans actually 62 - 0 - 11.

105 Kingsnorth

Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

20/21 Lullingstone

The wheat includes 43 acres of Buckwheat.

152 Oare

Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

149 Ospringe

Wheat actually 504 - 2 - 26, turnips or rape 57 - 1 - 38.

202 St Lawrence

Potatoes actually 27 - 3 - 30.

195 Sturry

Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

220 Woodnesborough

Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

11	Aughton	This is probably Aughton the parish near Ormskirk rather than Aughton the township in Halton parish near Lancaster.
40	Eccleston	This is Eccleston parish near Chorley rather than Eccleston township in Prescott parish near St Helens.
18	Bolton	Measured to nearest perch in the document.
50	Hale	There are two Hales, one in Cumberland and the other in Lancashire but both were in the Diocese of Chester. The document is endorsed as in Lancashire.
54	Hawkshead	Wheat actually 6 - 3 - 20.
69	Melling	There are and were two Mellings, both in Lancashire and both in the Diocese of Chester. The mention in the notes of the River Lune places this Melling as the one in the Hundred of Lonsdale.
102	Standish	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
111	Walton upon the Hill	Now of course in Liverpool.
118	Whalley	The parish of Whalley was huge, over 100,000 acres in 1801 and therefore this return must refer to the township in the parish.
121	Winwick	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

18	Asfordby	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
131	Brighthurst etc.	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
169/70	Carlton Curlieu	This document is unpaginated but lies between pages 169-70. Potatoes actually 0 - 0 - 20.
245	Diseworth	Turnips or rape actually 37 - 0 - 20.
770	Hothorpe	See Theddingworth below.
327	Goadby Marwood	Potatoes actually 8 - 2 - 20.
361	Harston	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
359	Market Harborough	Wheat actually recorded as "not 2 acres", potatoes as "not $\frac{1}{2}$ acre", peas as "not 1 acre".

- 540 Newbold Verdon Measured to the nearest $\frac{1}{2}$ acre in the document.
- 555 Oadby Turnips actually 8 - 2 - 30.
- 563 Orton on the Hill This entry is in the returns for the Diocese of Lincoln. In addition in the Diocese of Peterborough collection there is a return for Orton on the Hill. This second entry is clearly a reference to the same place and takes the form of a letter, which is transcribed in the notes; the letter however presents a different set of acreages, as follows: wheat 172, barley 142, oats 112, beans 25.
- 537 Rotherby Incorrectly endorsed as in Lincolnshire, I think that the place referred to is Rotherby of Hoby and Rotherby in Leicestershire.
- 770 Theddingworth The same document includes Hothorpe in Northamptonshire. For the acreages of this second place see the Northamptonshire entry. In 1801 Theddingworth was partly in Northamptonshire but mainly in Leicestershire. Today it is in Leicestershire. The hamlet of Hothorpe in the parish of Theddingworth was and still is entirely in Northamptonshire.
- 801 Twycross Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

- 295 Fleet Oats actually 952 - 1 - 12.
- 788 Tydd St Mary Potatoes actually 30 - 1 - 30.

LINCOLNSHIRE - KESTEVEN DIVISION

- 22 Ashby de la Launde Was in Kesteven in 1801 but now in Lindsey.
- 88 Billingham Peas actually $2\frac{1}{3}$ acres in the document.
- 105 Boultham Was in Kesteven in 1801 but now in Lindsey.
- 120 Braucewell and Dansby Now known as plain Braucewell.
- 202 Coleby Potatoes actually $3\frac{1}{2}$ acres in the document.
- 67 Fenton Potatoes actually "not 2 acres" in the document.
- 362 Harlaxton Potatoes actually 9 - 1 - 20.
- 524 Morton In 1801 as today there are two Mortons, one each in Lindsey and Kesteven. I suppose this could just as easily be the one in Lindsey.

534	Rauceby	This could be North Rauceby, South Rauceby or both taken together.
648	Scopwick	Potatoes actually 3 - 0 - 14, rye 1 - 1 - 4.
67	Stragglethorpe	Potatoes actually "not 2 acres" in the document.
735	Stroxton	Tares actually 1 - 2 - 20.
819	Walcot	This is Walcot 7 miles south of Sleaford not Walcot 8 miles north east of Sleaford.

LINCOLNSHIRE - LINDSEY DIVISION

9	Althorpe and Ancotts	Wheat actually 484 - 1 - 20.
15	Appleby	Wheat actually 287½ acres in the document, potatoes 32 - 1 - 16, beans 81 - 1 - 16.
20	Ashby	This entry assumed to be Ashby now near or in Scunthorpe.
21	Ashby by Spilsby	Now actually Ashby by Partney.
39	Authorpe	Was in Lindsey in 1801 but now in Kesteven.
75	Beesby	This could be Beesby of Hawersby cum Beesby or Beesby in the Marsh, both in Lindsey, I think the latter.
79	Belton	There is a Belton in Kesteven near Grantham and a Belton in Lindsey near Epworth. I think this is the latter.
102	Blyton	Barley actually 89½ acres in the document.
122	Branston	Was in Lindsey in 1801 but now in Kesteven. Potatoes actually 20½ acres in the document.
144	Burgh le Marsh and Winthorpe	The document is actually headed as Burgh with Winthorpe which see. This remark suggests the existence of another entry for Winthorpe. If this is so then it has not survived.
148	Burton Stather	Peas actually 41½ acres in the document.
159	Calcethorpe	Potatoes actually ½ acres in the document, peas 1/3 acres and beans 8 perches.
165	Canwick	Was in Lindsey in 1801 but now in Kesteven. Potatoes actually 4½ acres in the document.
299	Flixborough	Rye actually 52½ acres in the document.
157	Holton le Moors	Howton in the document but as the notes suggest it is in close proximity to Caistor. Holton le Moors seems most likely to be the place referred to.
408	Horncastle	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

477	Langton by Partney	Now actually Langton by Spilsby.
478	Langton by Wragby	Turnips or rape actually 42 - 1 - 10, rye 4 - 3 - 10.
452	Laughton	There was and is a Laughton in Kesteven also. I think from the size of the arable acres compared with the acreages in the early Census volumes this must be the Laughton in Lindsey.
600	Rand	Wheat includes 17 acres of Buckwheat.
654	Scremby	Rye actually 0 - 1 - 20.
679	Skendleby	Potatoes actually 3 - 1 - 20.
747	Swallow	Wheat actually 110½ acres in the document, rye 36½.
444&445	South Kelsey	These must be the united parishes of South Kelsey except that according to Samuel Lewis they were known as St Mary and St Nicholas.
815	Waddington	Was in Lindsey in 1801 but now in Kesteven.

181	Ruislip	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
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NORFOLK

55	Cogenhoe	There is some doubt over the first figure.
56	Corby	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
69	Deene with Deenethorpe	Wheat actually 132 - 1 - 6, potatoes 0 - 0 - 20.
74	Earls Barton	Turnips or rape actually 111 - 1 - 13.
113	Heyford	Was and is Upper Heyford and Nether Heyford.
15/770	Hothorpe	See note attached to Theddingworth, Leicestershire.
4	Little Addington	Turnips or rape entry includes tares also.
21-2	Little Billing	I am unsure to what extent these two returns overlap though the second note suggests that they refer to the same land.
132	Long Buckby	Wrongly endorsed on the document as in Bedfordshire.

- 172 Pitchley Turnips or rape entry includes coleseed also.
- 233 Silverstone Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
- 201 Sulgrave Wrongly endorsed on the document as in Oxfordshire.
- 15/490 Thorpe Lubenham Thorpe Lubenham was, in 1801, and is, mostly in Marston Trussell parish in Northamptonshire, but was partly in Lubenham parish in Leicestershire. The crop return is found with the Lubenham return.
- 239 Winwick Potatoes actually 1 - 3 - 20.

NORTHUMBERLAND

- 17 Bolam In 1801 there was a Bolam parish in Northumberland and a Bolam township in Gainford parish in Durham. Today the Northumberland Bolam is a locality and the Durham Bolam is a civil parish. The document is endorsed as in Northumberland and therefore counted in that county.
- 103 Shotley The civil parish is now known as Shotley Low Quarter, very much on the Durham/Northumberland border. There is of course Shotley Bridge which is in Durham.
- 26/206 Whitley Peas actually 77 - 1 - 20.

NOTTINGHAMSHIRE

See the note in the unknown counties list below number 132 Stapleford.

OXFORDSHIRE

- 18/3 Ascott-under-Wychwood to Shipton-under-Wychwood inclusive All these entries are in the same document, described as Shipton and its hamlets.
- For the Oxfordshire parishes of Fifield and Idbury see Gloucestershire.

RUTLAND

- 17 Barrowden There is a note which suggests that the average for barley is 230 acres and for peas and beans 130.
- 18 Belton Wrongly endorsed as in Lincolnshire. There is a Belton in Lincolnshire but it is in the Diocese of Lincoln where a crop return for it can be found. The Belton in the Diocese of Peterborough is Belton, near Uppingham in Rutland.

15/276	Empingham	Wheat actually 419 - 0 - 25, potatoes 5 - 1 - 2, turnips or rape 329 - 3 - 25.
139	Manton	Barley actually 23 - 3 - 20. Also 7 acres of clover.
135	North Luffenham	Wheat actually 176 - 2 - 20, peas 27 - 1 - 20, beans 136 - 0 - 20.
197	Stoke Dry	In 1801 this place extended into Leicestershire.
207	Thistleton	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.

12/15	Badger	But looks like Bagsore in the document. The PRO place name index leaves as "Bagsore".
12/62	Claobury Mortimer	Potatoes recorded as "impossible to be ascertained."
14/120	Grinshill	Wheat includes 4 acres of French wheat.
12/105	Halford	Looks like Hawford in the document, in which case it would be in Worcestershire.
12/117	Hopton Wafers	There is an identical entry for this parish in the returns of the Diocese of Lichfield and Coventry. It was definitely in the Diocese of Hereford.
14/166	Longnor	Potatoes actually 4 - 1 - 36, peas 18 - 0 - 27.
12/152	Lydham	Was partly in Montgomeryshire but mainly in Salop. Now in Salop.
12/155	Madeley	There is a Madeley in Staffordshire but that one was in the Diocese of Lichfield and Coventry. This entry must therefore refer to Madeley Market.
12/156	Mainstone	Was partly in Montgomeryshire but mainly in Salop. Now in Salop.
12/35	Meole Brace	The wheat acreage includes Muncorn i.e. wheat and rye mixed.
12/175	Neen Savage	Potatoes actually 2½ acres.
12/190	Pontesbury	This is the aggregate of the three different portions of the parish, they are all three itemised in the document.
14/209	Prees	Potatoes actually 59 - 3 - 35.
12/195	Pulverbatch	Wrongly endorsed as in Montgomeryshire.
14/235	Sherriffhales	In 1801 in both Staffordshire and Salop. Most of the people lived in Staffordshire but most of the land was in Salop. Today it is in Salop.

14/249	Stockton	This is assumed to be the civil parish in Shifnall Rural District and not one of two localities in the county.
12/109	Stottesdon	Endorsed as in Herefordshire. It was in fact in both Herefordshire and Salop but mainly in Salop. Today it is in Salop.
12/227	Sutton	Of the many Suttons in the county this is assumed to be Sutton in Shrewsbury Liberty.
14/272	Uffington	Potatoes actually 1 - 2 - 20.
14/276	Wem	Wheat acreage includes 27 acres of Buckwheat.
14/130	Weston	Wheat acreage includes 16 acres of French wheat.
12/246	Wistanstow	Potatoes actually 15 - 1 - 18.

27	Bedminster	Was in Somerset in 1801, now in Gloucestershire.
48	Brean	Actually Bune in the document but identified as Brean from the reference to Axbridge.
41	Brislington	Actually Brisseton in the document but counted as Brislington. Brislington in 1801 was in Somerset but is now in Gloucestershire.
61	Charlton Canfield	Now Charlton Horathorne.
121	Farnborough	Measured to the nearest perch in the document.
123	Frome Selwood	Potatoes actually recorded as greater than 1,000 acres.
125	Goathill	Was in Somerset in 1801, now in Dorset.
140	Hemington	Potatoes actually 6 - 0 - 20.
143	Ilminster	Actually Ilmiston in the document.
144&145	Ilton	Do these two returns refer to the same place? I cannot find a second Ilton anywhere. The two documents are clearly written in two different hands and it is interesting to note that neither return is set out on the official printed form. Number 144 is postmarked Ilminster and is therefore the settlement of Ilton 2½ miles from the centre of Ilminster. Number 145 is signed by W. Palmer, vicar.
170	Mark	Wheat actually 116 - 1 - 9, peas and beans 33 - 2 - 14.
205	Poyntington	Was in Somerset in 1801, now in Dorset.
195	Otterhampton	Wheat recorded as $123\frac{4}{5}$, surely $\frac{1}{2}$ intended?

220	Sandford Orcas	Was in Somerset in 1801, now in Dorset.
39	South Brent	I think known as Brent Knoll today.
255	Trent	Was in Somerset in 1801, now in Dorset.
260	Wanstrow	Wheat recorded as $62\frac{4}{3}$, surely } intended?

STAFFORDSHIRE

In addition, since 1801 a number of county boundary changes have taken place very often transposing parishes and places to adjacent counties. In particular the counties of the West Midlands and the Welsh Border underwent drastic changes. I hope that the changes which affected places for which 1801 Crop Returns exist have been adequately dealt with in the notes above. It must always be remembered that one of the aims of this volume has been to locate places in the counties in which they existed in 1801.
