

# Sir John Sinclair, the County Agricultural Surveys, and the Collection and Dissemination of Knowledge 1793–1817, with a Bibliography of the Surveys:

## Part 2.

Part 1 of this article, in *The Journal of the Edinburgh Bibliographical Society* 7 (2012) pp 29–70, examined the role of Sir John Sinclair in one of the most important of his series of publications, the first national agricultural survey of Great Britain, and provided a bibliography of the first series or ‘original’ reports (1793–1797). Part 2 gives an account of the printing, publishing and distribution, and a bibliography, of the ‘corrected’ or ‘reprinted’ surveys (1795–1817).

The Board of Agriculture’s ‘corrected’ or ‘reprinted’ county agricultural surveys were published as octavos to be sold by a wide range of booksellers throughout Britain between 1795 and 1817. Of the eighty-one counties surveyed, nine had reports with a second and even a third edition, and sixty-six had reports that were re-issued.<sup>1</sup> In addition, twelve reports were also advertised as published by Sherwood, Neely and Jones by 1815, though these have not been found (nos. 1.1, 11.1, 15.1, 17.3, 25.3, 31.1, 33.2, 54.1, 68.4, 77.2, 78.2, 79.3). It is likely that they were not actually printed.

Evidence of the printing and publishing history of the corrected surveys is fragmentary.<sup>2</sup> The Board’s outward letter books and register of letters have few references to either printers or booksellers, even of the principal ones involved. Evidence comes mainly from the imprints, along with other bibliographical features such as the printer’s name on the back of the title page (indicating a re-issue) and the last page of text (confirming the source). That evidence provides a framework for more fully understanding the attached bibliography of the corrected surveys and the role of the surveys in disseminating agricultural information.

### OVERVIEW OF THE BOARD’S POLICIES FOR THE CORRECTED SURVEYS

The Board’s minute books, together with evidence from the reports themselves, suggest that the Scottish ones, the ‘reports of North Britain’, were dealt with

separately from the English and Welsh. Indeed, one minute book from 1800 suggests they were supervised by Sir John Sinclair.<sup>3</sup> But, although there was autonomy, aspects of their management, printing, sale and distribution also embraced policies used for the English and Welsh ones.

#### PRINTING THE CORRECTED SURVEYS: THE BOARD'S POLICIES

The Board changed its policies for printing the surveys between 1795 and 1817. Its papers suggest the earliest ones were arranged by the surveyors. In 1796 Reverend Arthur Young was requested to print his survey of Sussex at the expense of the Board and at Sussex 'as soon as your manuscript shall be ready for the press';<sup>4</sup> it was not, however, published until 1808 when the Board had put other arrangements in place. The Board asked Lord Hawke 'whether you think the reports of the 3 Ridings [of Yorkshire] [1799, 1800, 1812] could be printed at York under your Lordship's direction to more advantage than in London.'<sup>5</sup> The surveyors submitted their printing bills to the Board for payment,<sup>6</sup> for Bailey's Northumberland (1797),<sup>7</sup> Billingsley's Somerset (1798),<sup>8</sup> and Brown's West Riding of Yorkshire (1799).<sup>9</sup> The Board also purchased entire print runs of reports from the surveyors and their printers: from the printers it bought copies of the Northumberland report,<sup>10</sup> as those of Somerset (1798),<sup>11</sup> and Argyll (1798).<sup>12</sup> It agreed 'to take the whole impression of the West Riding report' (1799).<sup>13</sup> From James Robertson, it requested the 'whole impression' of the Perth report (1799).<sup>14</sup> It bought the copies of the Fife report (1800) from its author John Thompson, who was offered '£80 for the 300 copies, for the plates and for the copyright'.<sup>15</sup> By January 1800 the Board informed Robert Douglas, author of the Roxburgh and Selkirk reports (1798), that it 'has repeatedly come to the Resolution of taking the whole impression of all the reports of North Britain, the printing of which they have in anywise sanctioned'.<sup>16</sup>

The Board started to exert greater control over the editing and production of the surveys after some of the earliest ones, including those of Clydesdale (1798) and the West Riding of Yorkshire (1799), were printed without its authorization. In February 1799, the Board set out that the reports were to be examined by 'three members beside the President' before they were printed.<sup>17</sup> Two months later it came 'to a Resolution not to be concerned with the printing of any report than the manuscript of which has not been examined and approved of by the Board'.<sup>18</sup> Again, in 1800 it asserted that it would not permit any survey to be printed 'without the examination by its members'.<sup>19</sup>

The Board also moved to control production. In a letter to Patrick Graham in May 1798, it noted that the question of printing the Stirling report, 'and where, will be determined by the Board'; that report was not, however, published until 1812.<sup>20</sup> In 1800 it informed Mr Tuke, author of the North Riding of Yorkshire survey (1800), that it intended to publish his report 'on their own account'.<sup>21</sup> It

also advised Robert Somerville who had been commissioned to undertake the survey of East Lothian (1805), that it would be ‘printed under their direction’.<sup>22</sup> In 1805 and 1806 surveyors were instructed that all printing would be under the direction of the Board and that it could not be undertaken until the Board instructed.<sup>23</sup> Printers were told to wait until they were ‘ordered’ by the Board to undertake any printing work;<sup>24</sup> they also had to wait on the Board’s orders before they could send stocks of the reports to booksellers for distribution and sale.<sup>25</sup> Even after the Board assigned their production to the London bookseller Richard Phillips, that policy continued. In 1807 it reminded Phillips that ‘the printing is to be carried on under the absolute direction and control of the Board’.<sup>26</sup>

When Phillips became bankrupt in late 1810, the Board was forced to change its policies. In April 1811 it informed surveyors whose reports were completed and ready for the press – such as Henry Strickland, author of the East Riding of Yorkshire (1812) – that they should print them at ‘their own expense’, but with an allowance from the Board to undertake that work.<sup>27</sup> Thus, William Aiton was requested to ‘manage the printing of the Ayrshire report [1811] with perfect convenience’.<sup>28</sup> In later years, he also made arrangements for his survey report of Bute (1816).<sup>29</sup> Dr Singer also made them for his report of Dumfries (1812).<sup>30</sup>

The Board did not want the surveys to be published as ‘private’ works, but as ‘public’ ones. However, a number of them were printed privately by means of subscription,<sup>31</sup> including some of the earliest. James Thomson published his survey of Fife (1800) in this way, as did Charles Findlater his report of Peeblesshire (1802). Although the Fife report appeared in the various versions of the ‘List of publications of the Board of Agriculture, which may be had of the publishers of this volume’, inserted at the end of the survey reports, from 1804 onwards, the Peeblesshire report was not included in it until it was re-issued by Sherwood, Neely and Jones in 1814. In addition, two further reports were, according to their imprint, ‘published for the author’ and therefore a private individual: the first and second editions as well as one issue of the third edition of Billingsley’s survey report of Somerset (1797, 1798, 1798), and Strickland’s East Riding of Yorkshire (1812). Both were published at dates when the Board directed the surveyors to make their own arrangements for printing.

#### THE PRINTERS OF THE SURVEYS

The printers of all but ten reports can be identified, the exceptions being Lancaster (1795), Kent (1796), Stafford (1796), Nottingham (1798), West Riding of Yorkshire (issue printed for James Watson, Edinburgh, 1800), Northampton (1813), and Northumberland, Cumberland and Westmoreland (1813). Thirty-three printers were employed to print the reports. Nine, who

printed the majority, were from London, while eleven were from Edinburgh. They included the significant firms William Bulmer and Co., and Buchanan McMillan, London, and Neill and Company, and Alexander Smellie, Edinburgh. Others were located in regional printing centres. There were three from Glasgow; two from Newcastle; and one from each of Aberdeen, Montrose, Paisley, Perth, Bath, Gloucester, Norwich, and York. They included the newspaper printers David Chalmers and Co. of the Aberdeen Journal (Aberdeen 1811), David Walker of the Gloucester Journal (Gloucester 1807) and the Glasgow University printer James Mundell (Clydesdale 1798). The local printing largely came between 1796 and 1800, and 1810 to 1812, when the Board instructed the surveyors to make their own arrangements.

All the English reports, with the exception of one issue of the West Riding of Yorkshire (1799), were printed in England; that issue was printed in Edinburgh on the initiative of its surveyor, Robert Brown, a farmer at Markle, East Lothian. The majority of the Scottish reports were printed in Scotland, though sixteen of them and their re-issues were printed in London in 1798, 1805, 1806, 1808, 1810, 1811, 1812, 1813 and 1815 (nos. 3.2, 3.3, 3.4, 6. 6.1, 8. 8.1, 10.2, 10.3, 10.4, 12.1, 13, 13.1, 13.2, 16, 16.1, 17, 18, 18.1, 19, 19.1, 19.2, 21.1, 22, 22.1, 24.2, 27, 27.1, 27.2, 28.1, 28.2, 28.3, 32, 32.1).

The use of printing centres meant that most of the reports were printed at some distance from the county that was their subject (a fact that was lamented by a few surveyors who complained of the large number of errata in their texts).<sup>32</sup> But some were also printed either within the county of the survey or in a neighbouring one. Thus, Paisley was the printing centre for the survey report of Renfrew (1812), Edinburgh for the Midlothian survey (1795), Glasgow for the Clydesdale survey (1798), Perth for the Perth survey (1799, 1813), Aberdeen for the Aberdeen survey (1811), and Montrose for the Kincardine survey (undated, 1810, 1813). In England, Gloucester was the printing centre for the Gloucester survey (1807, 1813), Newcastle for the surveys of Northumberland, Cumberland and Westmoreland (1799, 1800, 1805), York for the East Riding of York survey (1812), Bath for the Somerset survey (1797, 1798, 1798), Norfolk for Kent's survey of Norfolk (1796), and London for the Middlesex survey (1798, 1807, 1813). London was the printing centre for the reports in all its neighbouring counties: Buckinghamshire, Hertfordshire, Essex, Kent, Surrey and Berkshire. All the surveys printed in this way were either published before 1799, shortly after Richard Phillips became bankrupt in late 1810 or were Scottish ones.

Most of the printers were employed briefly, with twenty-six producing just one report. Another three printers each printed two reports. These included Thomas Gillet, Crown Court, Fleet Street, London, whose two surveys of Berkshire and Cheshire of 1808 and 1809 were also reissued in 1813 (nos. 35, 35.1, 35.2, 35.3, 38, 38.1, 38.2, 38.3, 38.4), and Edinburgh's Neill and Company, which printed the Angus and Shetland Islands reports for 1813 (nos. 2, 30). Others were there for a longer period William Bulmer and Co.'s

five reports (which included nine issues) were published in 1804, 1805 and 1812 (nos. 13, 13.1, 13.2, 48, 48.1, 48.2, 51, 57, 70.1). Alexander Smellie's five reports (which included ten issues) were published in 1809, 1810, 1811, 1812 and 1814 (nos. 6, 6.1, 17, 17.1, 17.2, 20, 31, 31.1, 33, 33.1). One printer, Buchanan McMillan, printed the majority of the reports, forty-four involving sixty-five issues between 1805 and 1813 (nos. 3.2, 3.3, 8, 8.1, 10.2, 10.3, 13.1, 18, 28.2, 32, 32.1, 34.1, 36, 39, 39.1, 41, 41.1, 41.2, 41.3, 41.4, 41.5, 42, 43, 43.1, 45, 47, 48.1, 49, 49.1, 51, 53.1, 53.2, 55, 57.1, 58.1, 58.2, 59, 59.1, 60.1, 61, 61.1, 63.2, 63.3, 64.1, 65, 67, 67.1, 68.3, 69.1, 70.2, 71.1, 72, 73, 73.1, 73.2, 73.3, 75, 78, 78.1, 79.1, 79.2, 80, 81, 81.1).

Many of the later re-issues, especially those with an imprint date of 1813, were sheets from a first or another issue bound with a new title page. Evidence for that practice is supported by bibliographical evidence in the surveys, including watermarks and the recording of printers' names at the end of the text as well as on the back of a title page.

Most of the re-issues were by the original printers. However, a few were printed by someone else. There were distinct printing and publishing patterns. One issue of the Nottingham survey report (1798) was printed by W. Smith, Castle Street, Oxford Market, London, while a further one, also from that same year, was printed by Buchanan McMillan (no. 64, 64.1). One issue of the third edition of the Somerset survey (1798) was printed by R. Cruttwell, Bath, while another one, also from that year, was printed by Buchanan McMillan (nos. 68.2, 68.3). Two issues of the Clydesdale report (1798) were printed by James Mundell, Glasgow, while a third one was printed by Buchanan McMillan (nos. 10, 10.1 and 10.2). One issue of Kent's Norfolk survey (1796) was printed by Crouse, Stevenson and Matchett of the Norfolk Press, Market Place, Norwich (no. 60), while another one was printed by Buchanan McMillan (no. 60.1). The reports of Roxburgh and Selkirk (1798), published in the same volume, have issues with imprints in Edinburgh and also London. The issues printed for G. and W. Nicol have both Edinburgh and London imprints, while the one printed for Richard Phillips had a London one (nos. 28, 28.1, 28.2). The West Riding of Yorkshire survey (1799) had issues with both imprints in Edinburgh and London (nos. 79, 79.1). The issue with the London imprint was printed by Buchanan McMillan, while the one printed in Edinburgh does not record the name of its printer. All of these reports were published and had a re-issue published in the same year, and were printed either by a provincial printer or a London one, usually Buchanan McMillan. In only one survey were different printers recorded on re-issues. One issue of the Shetland Islands report was printed by Neill and Co. in 1813 (no. 30), while another one, published in 1814, was printed by another Edinburgh printer, Stevenson and Company (no. 30.1).

Three reports are recorded as being printed by different firms, having one printer on the imprint and another at the end of the text: Suffolk (1804), East Lothian (1805), and Hereford (1805). Each of them had two issues in the same

year that were printed for either G. & W. Nicol or Richard Phillips. Their imprints state that W. Bulmer & Co. printed the issues for G. & W. Nicol, and Buchanan McMillan those for Richard Phillips. However, in the issues printed for Phillips, the last page of the text records that they were in fact printed by W. Bulmer and Co. Who printed these surveys is further confused by the Board's minute books which state that in 1805 W. Bulmer was to print the reports of East Lothian and Clydesdale and McMillan the Hereford one.<sup>33</sup>

While a glance at the bibliography suggests the printing of the different issues has a number of anomalies, this actually reflects the policies set out by the Board, and the arrangements for distribution (see below). The Board took the opportunity to revise first editions and to print a second or a third, usually between 1805 and 1808: Argyll (nos. 3, 3.1, 3.2, 3.3), Clydesdale (nos. 10.2, 10.3), Kent (nos. 53, 53.1, 53.2), Lincoln (nos. 57, 57.1), Northumberland (nos. 63, 63.1, 63.2, 63.3), Stafford (nos. 69, 69.1), and Midlothian (no. 21, 21.1). Their printing histories reflect the Board's move to print the reports under its direction and in London. Their first editions were printed by either provincial printers or W. Bulmer & Co., while their second or third were printed by Buchanan McMillan. Thus, the first edition of the Argyll survey report (1798) was printed by Mundell & Son and the second one (1805) by Buchanan McMillan. The second edition of the Clydesdale survey (1806) was printed by Buchanan McMillan who also printed one of the earlier issues from 1798 (the other was printed by J. Mundell, Glasgow). The first edition of the Lincoln report (1799) was printed by W. Bulmer & Co. and the second edition (1808) by Buchanan McMillan. After Richard Phillips became bankrupt in late 1810, the surveyors themselves made arrangements with provincial printers again for a short period. Formal arrangements resumed after 1813 when many of the survey reports were re-issued and their publication, distribution and sale was handled by Sherwood, Neely and Jones.

#### THE BOOKSELLERS

A large number of booksellers were involved in the corrected surveys. They had various roles. Writing of the late eighteenth century, John Feather observes that the term 'bookseller' 'was used to mean both retailer and publisher, and the two functions were indeed combined, in so far as 'publishers' were also retailers of their own products'.<sup>34</sup> At that time, the word 'publisher' was

beginning to take on its modern meaning of the copyright owner who financed and organised the publication of a book or newspaper. It was fully established in this sense by about 1820, displacing the word 'bookseller' which had formerly had this meaning. The change in meaning

corresponded with the separation of the two roles of publisher and retail bookseller.<sup>35</sup>

#### RELATIONS BETWEEN THE PRINTERS AND THE BOOKSELLERS

The bookseller and printer connexions are recorded on the imprints. The few reports that did not have an imprint were included in volumes containing two or more reports (nos. 21.2, 40, 40.2, 40.3, 74, 74.1, 74.3). The imprints record at least ten relationships during the period. These can be divided into two broad groups: reports produced by a printer and sold by one or more booksellers (who acted as a distributor or wholesaler), and reports printed for a bookseller or booksellers (who held their copyright). In the ten forms, 'x' is a printer, 'y' is a copyright holder and 'z' is a distributing or a wholesaling bookseller:

1. Printed at 'a' by 'x' for 'y' (printed at 'a' [,] by 'x' [,] for 'y')
2. Printed by 'x' (printed for 'x')
3. Printed by 'x' for 'y' (printed by 'x' [,] [:] for 'y')
4. Printed by 'x' and sold by 'y' (printed by 'x' [,] and [,] [,] and [,] And] [and] [:] sold by 'y')
5. Printed by 'x' for 'y', sold by 'z' (printed by 'x' [,] [;][:] [ ] for 'y' [; ] [;] and] sold by 'z')
6. Printed for 'y' (printed for 'y')
7. Printed for 'y' [by] 'x' (printed for 'y' [.] )
8. Printed for 'y' by 'x', sold by 'z' (printed for 'y' [; and] [; ] [:] [.] , sold by 'z')
9. Printed for 'y', sold by 'z' (printed for 'y' [;] [.] [.] by 'x' [:] [; and] sold by 'z')
10. Printed for 'y' and sold by 'z' and printed by 'x' (Printed for 'y' [; ] [.] sold by 'z' [; by ] [; by ] [.] by [.] 'x')
11. No imprint.

These different forms were used to varying extents for the printing, distribution and sale of the surveys. Those that were little used were generally noted in connection with reports printed by provincial printers and which were also distributed and sold by local booksellers (few reports did not have an arrangement for their distribution). The form "printed at 'a' by 'x' for 'y' (printed at 'a' [,] by 'x' [,] for 'y')"

was recorded on only one imprint: an issue of the Norfolk survey (1796) (no. 60), printed by Crouse, Stevenson and Matchett of the Norfolk Press, Market Place, Norwich. The form "printed by 'x'," in which a book was sold by the printer, is noted in two surveys (no. 21.1, 30), one of which was bound with another survey in the same volume (1813); the other was the abridged report of Midlothian (1795). The form "printed for 'y' by 'x' sold by 'z' (printed for 'y' [; and] [; ] [:] [.] , sold by 'z')"

on two surveys, Durham and the East-Riding of Yorkshire, both of which were printed by provincial printers (in Newcastle and York) and were published in 1810 and 1812 respectively (nos. 44, 77, 77.1).

Seven forms of imprints were widely used, some extensively over many years, others to a lesser extent over much shorter periods. Not all of them were used in any one year, though usually two or more were (**Table 1**).

The most widely used imprints between 1795 and 1817 have distinct patterns. In a broadly chronological order, the earliest was in the form of “printed by ‘x’ for ‘y’, sold by ‘z’(printed by ‘x’ [,] [;][:] [ ] for ‘y’ [ : ] [;] [; and] sold by ‘z’)”, used between 1795 and 1815. John Feather considers that it was the ‘fullest form of eighteenth-century English imprint’.<sup>36</sup> Between 1795 and 1800, and again from 1803 to 1807, it was recorded on nineteen imprints relating to seventeen reports. However, it was not used again until 1811, when it was found on one survey and another re-issue (no. 4.1, 39), and thereafter until 1815 on nine re-issues of reports first published in 1811, 1812 and 1813. Most of these reports were printed by Buchanan McMillan, though some were printed by W. Bulmer & Co. and by two printers in Bath (no. 68)

and Edinburgh (no. 21). They were for specific booksellers who held their copyright: seventeen issues were printed for G. Nicol or G. & W. Nicol, and after 1811, all were printed for Sherwood, Neely and Jones.

The form of “printed for ‘y’, sold by ‘z’, printed by ‘x’ (printed for ‘y’ [;] [.] sold by ‘z’ [; by ] [: by ] [. by] [.] ‘x’)” is recorded on thirty-seven reports which involved forty-nine issues between 1796 and 1811. They were printed in London, and in Edinburgh, which produced most of the Scottish reports. Thirty issues were printed by Buchanan McMillan. Another seven issues (from two surveys, Berkshire and Cheshire), were printed by T. Gillet, also of London. The remaining ones (all relating to Scottish reports) were printed by a further seven printers, including D. Buchan of Montrose, Alex Smellie of Edinburgh, and George Ramsay and Co. of Edinburgh. All of these surveys were printed for Richard Phillips, who used this form of imprint from 1805 and especially from 1807 when he took over the Board’s stock and until late 1810.

The form of “printed for ‘y’” is recorded much later in the Board’s publishing activities, in 1805, 1811, 1812, and 1814. It was largely used in connection with the Scottish surveys, which were printed at different times for three booksellers: Richard Phillips, G. & W. Nicol, and Sherwood, Neely and Jones. They included reports published for the first time such as Stirlingshire (1812), as well as re-issues. A further three imprints relating to two Scottish surveys have “printed for ‘y’” and the name of the printer recorded separately from that of the bookseller (nos. 17.1, 17.2 33, 66). All were printed in 1808, 1810 and 1811 for Richard Phillips.

The form of “printed for ‘y’, sold by ‘z’ (printed for ‘y’ [;] [.] [.] by ‘x’ [;] [; and ] sold by ‘z’)” was used sporadically throughout the Board’s publishing activities: between 1795 and 1799, 1809 and 1810. It was especially noted in 1813 when it was used in connection with forty-one issues of reports. With one exception, an issue of the Argyll survey report of 1798 (no. 3), all had a London imprint. The majority were re-issues of reports published some years earlier, though nine survey reports were being published for the first time. They were printed for a small number of booksellers. Before 1799, three English reports (nos. 53, 54, 69) were printed for G. Nicol and were sold by Messrs Robinson, Paternoster Row, and other booksellers. Between 1807 and 1809 they were printed for Richard Phillips and sold by three groups of booksellers, the first of which included Faulder & Son, Bond Street, London (nos. 34, 35.2, 76); a second one included Wilkie and Robinson, London (no. 46); a third one included provincial booksellers in Northamptonshire (no. 62). More than half of these reports (involving forty-one issues) were printed for Sherwood, Neely and Co. and were sold by G. Nicol or G. and W. Nicol of London.

The form “printed by ‘x’, sold by ‘y’ (printed by ‘x’ [; and] [;] [.] and] [.] And] [and] [:] sold by ‘y’)” was used between 1797 and 1800, and between 1811 and 1816 (nos. 2, 3.1, 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, 11, 15, 20, 25, 25.2, 26, 32, 39, 41, 41.1, 43, 52, 55, 59, 63, 63.1, 64, 68.1, 68.2, 73, 73.1, 73.2, 81). The imprint was used in fourteen Scottish surveys. Especially before 1811, they were printed

in Edinburgh and regional printing centres such as Glasgow, Perth, Paisley and Newcastle. The remaining ones were printed in London by Buchanan McMillan. All were sold by G. Nicol or G. & W. Nicol or G. & W. Nicol and Sherwood, Neely and Jones.

The form “printed by ‘x’ for ‘y’ (printed by ‘x’ [,] [:] for ‘y’)” is recorded in 1802 and between 1811 and 1815, especially in 1814 and 1815. It was used on reports printed in Edinburgh, though four of them (nos. 43.1, 51, 55.1, 81.1) had a London imprint. With the exception of these four, all were reports of Scottish counties (nos. 1, 12, 23, 24, 24.1, 30.1), with that of Peebles (1802) being published by subscription. Most of these Scottish reports were printed for Archibald Constable and Co., and another bookseller, located in London, such as Longman, Hurst, Rees, Orme, and Brown (nos. 1, 23, 24.1, 30.1), or G. & W. Nicol (no. 24). Other reports with this form of imprint were also printed for booksellers in Edinburgh and London. The report of Aberdeen (no. 1), was printed for the Edinburgh bookseller, James Ballantyne and Co., as well as London booksellers such as Longman, Hurst, Rees, Orme, and Brown, Gail and Curtis and Sherwood, Neely and Jones (no. 12). The four survey reports with this imprint had London imprints that were for London as well as provincial booksellers. For example, the report of the islands on the coast of Normandy included Londoners as well as Perrot and Chevalier of Jersey. These provincial booksellers were extensively used in the reports of Lancashire (no. 55.1) and South Wales (81.1). The Lancashire one had nine booksellers and that of South Wales five.

All this reflects changes in the Board’s policies for printing, distribution and sale of the surveys, and the use of different booksellers as well as different policies for dealing with the Scottish surveys. Each bookseller used the forms of imprints to varying extents; no one used all of them. The most important booksellers made widespread use of one or two, and little use of others. For example, Richard Phillips extensively used “printed for ‘y’ and sold by ‘z’ and printed by ‘x’,” while both G. and W. Nicol and Sherwood, Neely and Jones, most frequently used “printed for ‘y’ sold by ‘z’.” Some were used in connection with the Scottish surveys, with “printed by ‘x’ for ‘y’ and ‘printed for ‘y’” being especially noted.

#### THE BOOKSELLERS AND COPYRIGHT OF THE CORRECTED SURVEYS

The copyright of the reports was held in a number of ways. The Board’s minute books show that the authors were to assign their copyright to the Board.<sup>37</sup> Indeed, in May 1805 the Board recommended to accept the rule that ‘the Copy Right shall belong to the Board’.<sup>38</sup> After 1807, when the reports were being dealt with by Richard Phillips they were ‘to be considered as vested in Richard Phillips, who is to enjoy the right and advantage of printing and reprinting the

same in like manner as though he had purchased the copyright of the respective authors'.<sup>39</sup> After his bankruptcy the Board's records do not reveal how it was to be dealt with, either by the Board, or by its publishers. The imprints of the reports provide some further evidence, though they do not tell the full story. Imprints that have "printed for 'y'" record that a survey report was printed for a particular bookseller (or indeed author) who held its copyright. This form is recorded on 117 of the 158 imprints (thirty-four Scottish, eighty-one English and two Welsh) relating to the eighty-one surveys. An analysis of these imprints shows that the copyright was held by twenty-eight booksellers (ten Scottish and eighteen English) and two authors.

The imprints show some differences in the way the copyright was held between the Scottish and the English and Welsh survey reports. A larger number of the Scottish ones had more than one copyright holder: three issues of the Stirling and West Lothian reports (nos. 31, 33, 33.1) each had four such holders while those for Aberdeen and Dumfries (nos. 1, 12) each had three. Another six reports, which included eight issues (nos. 3, 10.1, 12.1, 23, 24, 24.1, 24.2, 30.1), each had two holders. However, the majority of the Scottish reports, seventeen reports involving thirty-four issues, each had one copyright holder. By comparison, only two reports in England and Wales had more than one copyright holder. The West Riding of Yorkshire survey (no. 79), printed for James Watson of South Bridge, Edinburgh, had two: Watson himself and G. Nicol of London. The Lancashire report (1815) had twelve, all local booksellers, in Liverpool, Manchester, Ormskirk, Blackburn, Preston, Rochdale, Wigan and Kirby Lonsdale; its 1814 issue had only one, G. and W. Nicol.

Three London booksellers had particular significance. Richard Phillips, between 1805 and 1810, held the copyright of thirty-one surveys involving forty-one issues, his name being recorded on sixty-three imprints relating to forty-nine surveys (nos. 3.2, 4.1, 6, 10.2, 13.1, 16, 17, 17.1, 17.2, 18, 19, 19.1, 22, 27, 27.1, 28.2, 33, 33.1, 34, 35, 35.1, 35.2, 35.3, 36, 37, 38, 38.1, 38.2, 38.3, 42, 44, 44.1, 45, 46, 47, 48.1, 49.1, 50, 53.2, 56, 56.1, 57.1, 58.2, 60.1, 61.1, 62, 63.3, 64.1, 65, 66, 67.1, 68.3, 69.1, 70.2, 71, 72, 74.2, 75, 76, 78.1, 79.1, 79.2, 80). Sherwood, Neely and Jones, whose names are on the imprints of fifty-seven reports involving seventy issues, held the copyright of forty-six between 1812 and 1815 (nos. 3, 4, 6.1, 10.4, 12.1, 13.2, 16.1, 18.1, 19.2, 22.1, 24.2, 27.2, 28.3, 34.1, 36.1, 37.1, 38.4, 41.2, 41.3, 41.4, 41.5, 42.1, 44.2, 45.1, 46.1, 47.1, 48.2, 49.2, 50.1, 53.3, 56.1, 57.2, 58.3, 59.1, 60.2, 61.2, 62.1, 63.4, 64.2, 65.1, 67.2, 69.2, 70.3, 71.1, 72.1, 75.1, 76.1, 80.1, 81.1). G. Nicol, described variously as bookseller to the King, the Prince of Wales and also to the Board of Agriculture on imprints, and G. and W. Nicol, held the copyright for twenty-two reports that involved twenty-six issues, largely between 1798 and 1805 (nos. 3.3, 10.3, 13, 21, 24, 28, 28.1, 31, 48, 49, 53, 53.1, 54, 57, 58, 58.1, 60, 61, 63.2, 64, 67, 69, 70, 70.1, 78, 79). The firm is recorded on ninety-one imprints.

Booksellers with a smaller role included Longman, Hurst, Rees, Orme and Brown of London, who held the copyright of two reports (nos. 1, 12). Outside that bookselling centre, the most important were the Edinburgh booksellers Archibald Constable and Co. (nos. 1, 23, 24, 24.1, 24.2, 30.1) and William Creech (nos. 31). A number of other Scottish booksellers each had the copyright of one or two reports, all of which related to Scottish counties (nos. 1, 3, 10.1, 12, 17.1, 25.1, 33, 33.1). Two authors whose reports were printed for them were also their copyright holders: Somerset (no. 68, 68.1, 68.2), and the East Riding of Yorkshire (nos. 77, 77.1).

Booksellers transferred copyright to one another usually when there was a change in the Board's use of booksellers, or new ones became involved. For example, most of the second and the third editions of reports were held by different copyright holders. Richard Phillips also took over the copyright of a number of reports in 1805 from earlier holders. From 1813, Sherwood, Neely and Jones held the copyright of many issues of reports, also re-issuing them to provide a nearly comprehensive set.

Different booksellers held the copyright of some of the surveys at the same time and had their own issues (and their own distribution patterns). These were reports printed for various booksellers in their first year of publication. They involved twenty-one reports (six Scottish and fifteen English) published between 1798 and 1811, particularly in 1804, 1805, 1806 (nos. 10.2, 10.3, 13, 13.1, 48, 48.1, 49, 49.1, 53.1, 53.2, 61, 61.1, 63.2, 63.3, 70, 70.1), 1809, 1810 and 1811 (nos. 19.1, 19.2, 22, 22.1, 34, 34.1, 36, 36.1) which had issues printed for both G. Nicol (and G. and W. Nicol) and Richard Phillips.

#### THE BOOKSELLERS AND THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE SURVEYS

The London and Edinburgh booksellers could just have the copyright, or they could hold the copyright and also sell and distribute that report.

One of the biggest owners, Sherwood, Neely and Jones, recorded on seventy imprints relating to seventy reports, actually distributed only four, all published between 1812 and 1814 (nos. 2, 5, 8, 20). Others were more active. G. Nicol and G. & W. Nicol, distributed seventy-one issues relating to fifty-nine surveys (nos. 2, 3.1, 3.4, 5, 6.1, 8, 10, 10.3, 10.4, 11, 13, 13.2, 15, 16.1, 18.1, 19.2, 20, 21, 22.1, 24, 26, 27.2, 28.3, 32, 34.1, 35.4, 36, 36.1, 37.1, 38.4, 39, 41, 41.1, 42.1, 43, 44.2, 45.1, 46.1, 47.1, 48.2, 49.2, 50.1, 52, 53.3, 55, 56.1, 57.2, 58.3, 59, 60.2, 61.2, 62.1, 63, 63.1, 64.1, 63.4, 64.2, 65.1, 66.1, 67.2, 69.2, 70.3, 71.1, 72.1, 73, 73.1, 73.2, 75.1, 76.1, 80.1, 81). Archibald Constable and Co., who held the copyright of six surveys, distributed sixty-two issues relating to forty-two surveys (nos. 2, 3.2, 3.4, 4, 4.1, 5, 6, 6.1, 7, 8, 8.1, 10.2, 10.4, 11, 13.1, 13.2, 16, 16.1, 17, 18, 18.1, 19, 19.1, 19.2, 20, 22, 22.1, 26, 27, 28.2, 28.3, 32, 32.1, 34, 35, 35.1, 35.2, 35.3, 35.4, 38, 38.1, 38.2, 38.3,

42, 46, 48, 48.1, 49.1, 53.2, 57.1, 58.2, 60.1, 61.1, 63.3, 64.1, 67.1, 68.3, 69.1, 70.2, 72, 76, 78.1, 79.1, 79.2).

William Creech, recorded on the imprints of thirty-two issues relating to twenty-four surveys (nos. 3.1, 3.3, 3.4, 10, 10.3, 10.4, 13, 13.2, 15, 17, 21, 28, 28.1, 31, 45, 48, 49, 53, 53.1, 54, 57, 58, 58.1, 61, 63.2, 64, 67, 69, 70, 70.1, 78, 79), was a major distributor. In Dublin, Martin Keene (also referred to as Martin McKeene on nos. 38.1, 38.2, 38.3) distributed thirteen issues relating to six surveys (nos. 17, 35, 35.1, 35.2, 35.3, 35.4, 38, 38.1, 38.2, 38.3, 56, 72, 76), while John Archer had this role for sixty-two issues relating to thirty-four surveys (nos. 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 6, 10, 10.2, 10.3, 11, 13, 13.1, 16, 19.1, 21, 27, 28, 28.1, 28.2, 31, 35, 35.1, 35.2, 35.3, 38, 38.1, 38.2, 38.3, 45, 46, 48, 48.1, 49, 49.1, 53, 53.1, 53.2, 54, 56, 57, 58, 58.1, 58.2, 60.1, 61, 61.1, 63.2, 63.3, 64, 64.1, 67, 67.1, 68.3, 69, 70, 70.1, 70.2, 72, 76, 78, 78.1, 79, 79.1, 79.2).

Three of the main copyright holders utilised a number of booksellers in London, Edinburgh and Dublin to distribute and sell the reports. In their imprints, the London booksellers were always recorded first, followed by those in Edinburgh and then Dublin. Richard Phillips (**Table 2**) had between 1795 and 1811 thirteen such booksellers. By comparison Sherwood, Neely and Jones (**Table 3**) used a smaller network of booksellers to distribute their surveys, mostly in 1813. George Nicol and G. and W. Nicol and Co. (**Table 4**) connected with five booksellers in London and one in each of Edinburgh and Dublin between 1795 and 1807.

The booksellers in these networks were involved meantime in spreading their own surveys locally and nationally, contributing to the vast enterprise caught in the bibliography, and to the realization of Sir John Sinclair's ideas on the role and function of agricultural knowledge.

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY OF THE CORRECTED SURVEYS

Like the bibliography of the original surveys in Part 1, this for the corrected surveys is also based on the holdings of the University of Edinburgh Library, the National Library of Scotland and the Royal Highland and Agricultural Society of Scotland, at Ingliston House, Ingliston, Midlothian. However, as the publishing of the corrected surveys is complex, with a significant number of issues and re-issues, some of which are not widely available, issues of surveys that fill a gap in the bibliography have been included from other libraries. In Edinburgh, these include the holdings of the Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh, and Edinburgh Central Library (which has holdings of Scottish surveys), both of which have comprehensive collections; the former library has imprints that are not found anywhere else. Their holdings have been recorded in a systematic manner.

Surveys have also been recorded from other libraries outwith Edinburgh that have significant collections: Newcastle University Library, Southampton University Library, and the Museum of English Rural Life, University of Reading. However, these are not recorded in a systematic manner. Rather the bibliography records specific issues in their collections that are not found elsewhere. For some of them, there are only a few copies or even only one



survey. For example, Glasgow University Library has one imprint (no. 17) that I have not found elsewhere, as has Southampton University Library (no. 12.1). Others are also held by Newcastle University Library (no. 17.2, 27, 27.1, 28.1, 33.1, 35.2, 38.3, 44.1) and the Museum of English Rural Life, University of Reading (nos. 30, 38.2, 55, 73, 73.1). The approach used in the compilation of this bibliography ensures that this bibliography of the surveys supersedes all earlier ones.<sup>40</sup> All copies of the survey included in this bibliography have been examined. Again, electronic resources have been included from Eighteenth Century Collections Online, English Short Title Catalogue and Making of the Modern World.

Surveys have been arranged alphabetically by country. Issues and re-issues are included in chronological order. Where re-issues and second and third editions have a different title, this has also been included. Where re-issues do not have a title included before their imprint, they have the same one as the first issue of a survey. Where two issues of a survey have been published in the same year, they have not been included in any particular order, as evidence is not available to suggest which issue was published first. Different issues sometimes have only minor differences in their imprints, such as stylistic ones (e.g. the use of hyphens in some issues, or spelling mistakes), and close attention has been given to how the imprints have been presented. The spelling of a small number of booksellers varies between imprints, and their names are presented as recorded on the imprints. The punctuation is recorded as found on the survey imprints.

Re-issues of surveys that are recorded as having been issued by Sherwood, Neely and Jones after 1813, but have not been found in an extensive review of the surveys, are also recorded. The basis for the evidence on them is the 'List of publications of the Board of Agriculture, which may be had of the Publishers of this volume', issued by Sherwood, Neely and Jones, in the survey reports of Cornwall (no. 39.1), Dorset (no. 49.3), and Warwick (no. 73.3). These surveys have been published as they represent some of the last surveys to be published and also re-issued by Sherwood, Neely and Jones.
